This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students achieving at least a 'C' in Maths, English and Science in Year 7 to 9 to at least 90% and to sustain those results that are at or above 90%.

- Achieve a 90% success rate of Year 12 students participating to complete the Bronze level stage of the Duke of Edinburgh program.
- Achieve a 100% success rate of Year 12 students leaving school with their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA).

Our initiatives include

- Reviewing reading data using Fountas & Pinnell and STAR Reader.
- Continuing the School Duke of Edinburgh Program and the Certificate II in Workplace and Vocational Pathways.
- Continuing the Quick Smart program including the Literacy & Numeracy Modules.
- Maintaining the Accelerated Reader program for Year 7 to 9.
- Maintaining the use of Online textbooks from Year 7 to 9.

Evidenced by:

- Families, students and local employers eg Stanwell have indicated the Duke of Edinburgh program has been 'instrumental' in them gaining employment.
- The Certificate II WVP Program has helped students gain 2 points for their QCE
- STAR Reader testing maths appropriate reading age books linked to students' ability levels. These results are tracked through pre and post testing.
- This Data identifies students to work one on one with TA's in an intervention program using Fountas & Pinnell. These results are validated by an external "expert".
- The Quick Smart Program is academically verified by New England University. A comprehensive report is then presented to the school for review.




Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employing 2 Teachers to decrease class sizes in Junior Secondary. \$ 175,000
 - Employing Teacher Aides to administer and record data for the Fountas and Pinnell (Reading), Quick Smart (Numeracy) and Accelerated Reader programs. \$ 145,000
 - Purchasing specific programs and licences to improve Numeracy, Literacy and Reading outcomes e.g. Quick Smart, Accelerated Reader and Mathletics & Turnitin. \$ 17,000
 - Purchasing specific program services for Junior Boys and Girls to promote resilience and well-being. \$ 2,000
 - Funding Duke of Edinburgh registration Fees and Adventurous Journey Camp Fees. \$ 2,672
 - Employing Tech Support (0.2 Full-time equivalent) to assist with BYOx program across the school. \$ 18,000
