Thank you, Mr Anderson, for making a difference!

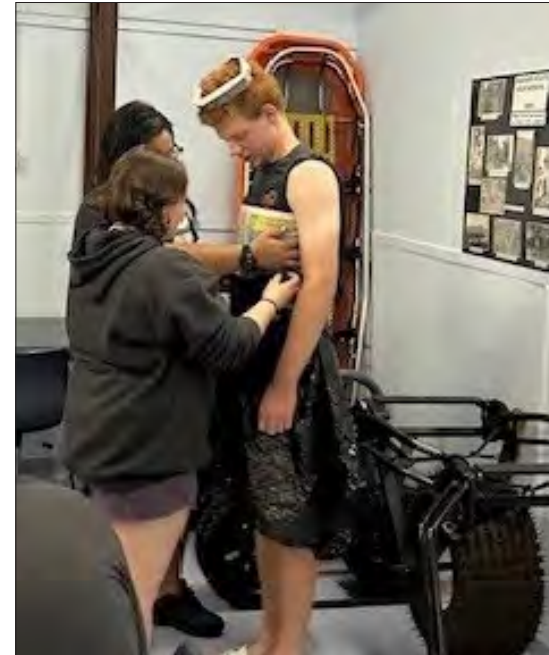



Up to four Hawker Scholarships are awarded each year and each undergraduate residential scholarship is valued at \$75,000 over three years.

Applications close at 5pm on Monday 6 January 2025 ACDT.

Late applications will not be assessed.

Outstanding applicants are shortlisted from their online submission and interviewed by the Hawker Trustees, via Zoom, at the end of January. Selection is largely based on personal qualities, leadership and academic achievements.

The prestigious Hawker Scholarships perpetuate the memory of Australian scholar, soldier, pastoralist and statesman Charles Allan Seymour Hawker (1894-1938).

2025-2026 Deadly Start School-Based Traineeship Program APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN!

This unique opportunity provides Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, who will be entering Year 11 of 2025, with a direct pathway into the healthcare industry.

Spaces in this program are, however, extremely limited, and demand is high across Queensland, so students will need to act fast!

Partnering with Queensland Health, Connect 'n' Grow (as the Registered Training Provider), in partnership with Seed Foundation Australia and Seed Employment (GTO) is offering culturally supportive pathways for your future Year 11 students to kickstart their careers in health. By completing the **HLT23221 Certificate II in Health Support Services** during the first six months, students then become eligible to progress into a Queensland hospital-based traineeship and earn while they learn, working towards their **HLT33115 Certificate III in Health Services Assistance**.

We've been advised that positions will be offered at the following Hospital and Health Service (HHS) locations for the training component on a 1-day-per-week basis: **Caboolture, Cairns, Cleveland, Ipswich, Logan, Mango Hill, Mount Isa, Mooloolaba, Rockhampton, Southport, Sunnybank, Toowoomba, Townsville, and Windsor**. The program in Mackay will be running in a block, with several other locations in rural and remote areas currently being discussed regarding their delivery format.

With only a **limited number of traineeships available at each site**, we encourage students to **submit their 'Deadly Start School-Based Traineeship application' as soon as possible**. Once positions are filled, the opportunity for a school-based traineeship in 2025 will be closed. Make sure you take advantage of this incredible chance to make your mark in the healthcare industry.
